The total proposed school tax levy of 41.6 mills includes 25.0 mills specifically voted for general maintenance and operation, 1.84 mills voted for dedicated maintenance and operation dedicated specifically for mills voted for dedicated maintenance and operation expenditures, dedicated specifically for the purposes of purchasing school buses, making building improvements, purchasing equipment, and paying on revolving loans, and 14.76 mills voted for debt service previously voted as a continuing levy pledged for the retirement of existing bonded indebtedness. The surplus revenues produced each year by debt service millage may be used by the district for other school purposes. The total proposed school tax levy of 41.6 mills represents the same rate presently being collected.
