42.1 MILL SCHOOL TAX

The total rate proposed above includes the uniform rate of tax of 25.0 mills (the "Statewide Uniform Rate") to be collected on all taxable property in the State and remitted to the State Treasurer pursuant to Amendment No. 74 to the Arkansas Constitution to be used solely for maintenance and operation of schools in the State. As provided in Amendment No. 74, the Statewide Uniform Rate replaces a portion of the existing rate of tax levied by this School District and available for maintenance and operation of schools in this District. The total proposed shool tax levy of 42.1 mills includes 25.0 mills specifically voted for general maintenance and operation, 1.9 mills voted for dedicated maintenance and operation expenditures, dedicated specifically for the purposes of purchasing school buses, making building improvements, purchasing equipment, and paying on revolv loans, 10.8 mills voted for debt service previously voted as a continuing levy pledged for the retirement of existing bonded indebtedness, which inded indebtedness will ben ed from the proceeds of the propose onds described below and 4.41 debt new de service mills service mil's plus the debt ser mills, w 0.8 exis ch debt se ue af er retirement of mills will co now pledged, will the bonds to t service tax until ontinuing sment of prosed bonds to in the prince, amount of and which will mature the osed bonds to be' \$76, 45, over a period of 30 years and will be issued for the appose of refunding the District's of standing bonded ness, and for constructing f 30 years and will be and eq. ping a new 7-9 Jr. High Complex including an auditorium and and eq ulti-purpose facility and paving; constructing and equipping a new K-6 Langston Elementary School and paving; and constructing, refurbishing, remodeling, paving and equipping other school facilities.
