Instructions to Voter:



- A) Fill in the oval to the left of the name of your choice. You must blacken the oval completely, and do not make any marks outside of the oval. You do not have to vote in every race.
- B) Do not cross out or erase, or your vote may not count. If you make a mistake on your ballot, return it to an Election Official for a replacement ballot. You may replace up to two (2) ballots in an election.
- C) Vote on tax measure below by placing an appropriate mark (blacken the oval) either "FOR" or "AGAINST".
- D) Marking Multiple ovals will void the ballot.

48.9 MILL SCHOOL TAX

The total tax rate proposed above includes the uniform rate of tax of 25.0 mills (the "Statewide Uniform Rate") to be collected on all taxable property in the State and remitted to the State Treasurer pursuant to Amendment No. 74 to the Arkansas Constitution to be used solely for maintenance and operation of schools in the State. As provided in Amendment No. 74, the Statewide Uniform Rate replaces a portion of the existing rate of tax levied by this School District and available for maintenance and operation of schools in this District. The total proposed school tax levy of 48.9 mills includes 25.0 mills specifically voted for general maintenance and operation, 15.5 mills voted for debt service previously voted as a continuing levy pledged for the retirement of existing bonded indebtedness, and 8.4 new debt service mills. The 8.4 new debt service mills plus the 15.5 existing debt service mills now pledged for the retirement of existing bonded indebtedness, which debt service mills will continue after retirement of the bonds to which now pledged, will be a continuing debt service tax until the retirement of proposed bonds to be issued in the principal amount of \$10,255,000, and which will mature over a period of 30 years, and will be issued for the purpose of constructing and equipping a new High School; and constructing, refurbishing, remodeling and equipping other school facilities. The surplus revenues produced each year by debt service millage may be used by the District for other school purposes. The total proposed school tax levy of 48.9 mills represents a 8.4 mill increase over the current tax rate..
