## HOT SPRINGS MILLAGE

42.1 MILL SCHOOL TAX he Board of Directors of Hot Springs School District No. 6 of Garland County, Arkansas proposes a total school tax rate of 42.1 miles on the dollar of the assessed value of taxable property located in this School District. The proposed tax includes the uniform rate of tax (the "Statewide Uniform Rate") to be collected on all taxable property in the State and remitted to the State Treasurer pursuant to Amendment No. 74 to the Arkansas Constitution to be used solely or maintenance and operation of schools in the State. As provided in Amendment No. 74, the Statewide Uniform Rate replaces a portion of the existing rate of tax levied by this School District and available for maintenance and operation of schools in this District. he total proposed school tax levy of 42.1 mills includes 25.0 mills specifically voted for general maintenance and operation, 1.9 mills voted for dedicated maintenance and operation expenditures, dedicated specifically for the purposes of purchasing school buses, making building improvements, purchasing equipment, and paying on revolving loans, and 15.2 mills voted for debt service previously voted as a continuing levy pledged for the retirement of existing bonded indebtedness. The surplus revenues produced each year by the debt service millage may be used by the District for other school purposes. The total proposed school tax levy of 42.1 mills represents the same rate presently being levied.
